SOSCV! Donations Now Top \$50,000 for Schools

SOSCV!, a non-profit organization established in March of this year to help reduce the impact of budget cuts in education, has reached another milestone along its path to its ultimate goal of \$3.2 million in funding for the school district.

Donations recently topped \$50,000 from almost 200 donors ranging from businesses to families with and without children in the schools.

The organization's goal is to raise \$365 per student, or \$1 per day, which would enable SOSCV! to

restore over \$3.2 million in funding to the District.

"The community has not yet begun to experience the impact of the worst of the budget cuts, as the coming round will most likely begin to affect their students' classrooms directly.

next possession, Chapman got back in there and was exactly what the Condors needed.

On the Wildcats' next possession, with time winding down, a double penalty pushed them back 20 yards, forcing them to throw.
